



FROM THE **FXECUTIVE PRODUCER**

From its inception, Tarell Alvin McCraney's vision for We Are Gathered included fully breaking the fourth wall and offering an opportunity for couples to get married or renew vows on stage at the end of the play. If you are able to witness one of these unique experiences today, I hope you

have a memory to cherish!

One of Arena's superpowers is gathering people. Arena is a physical communing place, and theater is an art form that celebrates the marriage of freedom of thought and debate of contrary opinions. What you may not realize is that, in addition to the 40-odd performances per production that Arena produces, we are also host to as many as 100 other events annually. From large and complex gatherings like The Atlantic Festival to small monthly meetings with our local Southwest Neighborhood Assembly. Family dinners with local folks hosted by the SWBID and career fairs for thousands of iobseekers hosted by the DC Department of Employment Services, Inauguration balls for political types, and for a few years now, a great late-night end-of-conference party with the Congressional Black Caucus. A crowning achievement for Arena was to be a major vaccination center with MedStar Health at the height of the pandemic.

We knew when we opened the Mead Center there was potential for all sorts of ways to gather people and ideas. Today's gathering is to witness a dramatic story well told and to celebrate in a union of souls, in sickness and in health. We have been home to many a first date and even some formal wedding proposals. Another fun fact you may not realize is that Arena is a unique destination for weddings and receptions. A highlight was in the 2014/15 Season when we launched a "Win a Wedding" contest in conjunction with our production of Fiddler on the Roof. Google it!

As we begin to anticipate Arena's 75th Anniversary Season, creating memories is top of mind. We have recently celebrated one of our most cherished memories with a fantastic anniversary present: there are now beautiful signs on our 1100 block of 6th Street SW declaring Zelda Fichandler Way. Now we can all say, "Take Zelda's way to arrive at Arena Stage."

Let me not miss tapping our memory for the legendary Tom Fichandler as well. Seventy-five years is only possible because of a collective effort, a community, a gathering. Most definitely, our audience is a critical part of this equation. I am delighted to conspire together today (meaning "breathe as one"). May your memories and anniversaries inspire joy for you today and every day.

**Some will say that all we have are the pleasures of this moment, but we must never settle for that minimal transport; we must dream and enact new and better pleasures, other ways of being in the world, and ultimately new worlds. Queerness is a longing that propels us onward, beyond romances of the negative and toiling in the present.

Queerness is that thing that lets us feel that this world is not enough, that indeed something is missing.**

-José Esteban Muños, Cruising Utopia: The Then and There of Queer Futurity

At one point, I playfully suggested an alternate title for this article as, "How I Learned to Cruise and Everything That Followed." Such a title hints at the impossibility of laying out the myriad layers within this work. Tarell Alvin McCraney's We Are Gathered is an onion, an ephemeral onion at a crossroads of queer pasts, dangers, futurity, hope, and potential utopia. Maybe all that simply means is possibility. Set between what has been and what might be, We Are Gathered centers on queer families and reflects on how LGBTQIA+ people create family and make lives for themselves in a world that

often does not even intend for them to exist. History does not exist in a straight line, but it is mostly accurate to suggest that LGBTQIA+ people have always existed on the margins, and sometimes explicitly outside, of society.

We Are Gathered invites us into the outside and open-air spaces where a type of liberation is found in pleasures plundered in such places as municipal parks. There's a name for this game of exchanging communications towards potential sexual gratification; it's called cruising. According to the OED

to cruise is "to walk or drive about (the streets) in search of a casual sexual (esp. homosexual) partner; to solicit (a person), entice." Our English word 'cruise' is etymologically related to a Dutch word kruisen (to cross), which means "to sail crossing to and fro, to traverse and cross the seas." This sense of crossing a line is apt because cruising, according to some, violates decency and such social norms. There is a long history of parks and green spaces as places that allows for freedom and excess, including the enjoyment of various transgressions not readily available in the day-to-day world. Sources as varied as classical Greek texts and accounts of medieval feast celebrations detail how parks and public squares, at designated times, function as spaces where the

traditional order is suspended and a type of topsyturvy reversal of norms is permitted. In We Are Gathered, the park exists "in

the mode of the festival" (Foucault) that enables nontraditional ideas and power structures to thrive. However, cruising is not just about sex. José Esteban Muñoz in Cruising Utopia invites an expansive understanding of "cruising" as enabling varied, creative potentialities for imagining and mapping a queer utopia. "What We Want, What We Believe," a manifesto featured in a 1971 issue of the gay liberation journal Gay Flames, expressed such a vision by saying, "We want a new society [...] We want liberation of humanity." LGBTQIA+ rights movements continue to work vehemently towards realizing that assertion. Decades of organizing and fighting culminated in a 2015 US Supreme Court victory legalizing same-sex unions nationwide.

As the ten-year anniversary of that ruling approaches, McCraney's play reimagines the traditional marriage plot, the earliest form of which date to 2nd century AD Greek Romance novels, through a Black queer lens. A requisite of the marriage plot is a meeting scene in which two young people of marriable age encounter one another for the first time, or are introduced to the audience, in an inappropriate context and under conditions that would make uniting in marriage impossible. In Romeo & Juliet, the two families are mortal enemies in an active feud. In Sondheim and Wheeler's A Little Night Music, inspired by Bergman's 1955 film Smiles of a Summer Night, a romance between Anne and Henrik is made impossible because Anne is married to Henrik's father.

We Are Gathered
presents a classic
boy-meets-boy
story in which
more than one

circulates as a
way of highlighting

tensions between public and private, honorable and shameful, and appropriate and verboten. It is a play about wrestling with extremes in attempts to bring about order, which is perfectly exemplified by Wallace Tre II's unveiling of his tortured interiority in contrast to a bracing exterior world. With relief, W. Tre welcomes, "you made it." Love, lives, and utopias are all made through great effort by individuals and communities. What happens next, we make it.



TARELL ALVIN MCCRANEY (Playwright) is Artistic Director of Geffen Playhouse. In this role, he is responsible for identifying, developing, and programming new works and re-envisioned classics. He sets the strategic artistic course for the Geffen's Gil Cates and Audrey Skirball Kenis Theaters. McCraney is an award-winning writer, producer, and educator, best known for his acclaimed trilogy, The Brother/Sister Plays. His script In Moonlight Black Boys Look Blue is the basis for the Oscar-winning film Moonlight directed by Barry Jenkins, for which McCraney and Jenkins also won a Best Adapted Screenplay Oscar. ARENA LEADERSHIP

HANA S. SHARIF (Artistic Director) has enjoyed a multi-faceted theater career, including roles as an artistic leader, director, playwright, and producer with a specialty in strategic and cross-functional leadership. Hana began her professional career as an undergraduate student at Spelman College. From 1997 to 2003, Hana served as the co-founder and Artistic Director of Nasir Productions, a theater dedicated to underrepresented voices challenging traditional structure. Hana joined the Tony® Award-winning regional theater, Hartford Stage, in 2003. During her decadelong tenure at Hartford Stage, Hana served as the Associate Artistic Director, Director of New Play Development, and Artistic Producer. Hana launched the new play development program, expanded the community engagement and civic discourse initiatives, and developed and produced Tony®, Grammy, Pulitzer, and Obie Award-winning shows. Starting in 2012, she served as Program Manager at ArtsEmerson, a leading world theater company based at Boston's Emerson College. During her tenure at ArtsEmerson, Hana launched an Artists in Residency program, led a research program assessing barriers to inclusion across the region, and leveraged her regional theater experience to freelance produce for smaller theater companies looking to expand and restructure their administrative teams. Hana was Baltimore Center Stage's Associate Artistic Director from 2014 to 2019 and was the architect of the innovative CS Digital program: a platform that pushes the boundaries of traditional theater and looks at the nexus point between art and technology. Her other achievements at Baltimore Center Stage included prototyping the Mobile Unit focused on historically underserved audiences, strengthening community engagement, producing multiple world and regional premieres, and helping to guide the theater through a multi-million dollar building renovation and rebranding effort. Hana became the first Black woman to lead a major regional theater in 2018 when she was named the Augustin Family Artistic Director of The Repertory Theatre of St. Louis. During her tenure at The Rep, Hana guided the organization through a strategic alignment, revolutionized the New Works program, expanding access to underserved communities, and centering equity and anti-racism as the organization's foundational values. Hana holds a BA from Spelman College and an MFA from the University of Houston. Hana is the recipient of USITT's 2023 Distinguished Achievement Award, Spelman's 2022 National Community Service Award, the 2009-10 Aetna New Voices Fellowship, EMC Arts Working Open Fellowship, and Theatre Communications Group (TCG) New Generations Fellowship. Hana is a founding member of The Black Theatre Commons (BTC). She serves on the board of directors for the TCG. BTC. and the Sprott Family Foundation.

EDGAR DOBIE (Executive Producer) Born in Vernon, British Columbia, a village next to the Rocky Mountains (three years after Arena had its first performance in 1950), I am one of five brothers raised by my Dad Edgar, a mechanic and small businessman, and Mom Connie, a telephone operator and union organizer. I am the only Dobie to make a career in theater. Luckily for me, drama was an arts elective I was offered at the tender age of 12 so I hung up my hockey skates and joined the drama class, led by teacher Paddy Malcolm and her fledgling Powerhouse Community Theater after school. By the time I graduated from high school, we volunteers had built ourselves a 200-seat, fully equipped theater on its own piece of land in the center of town and found a sold-out audience for the full season of plays we had on offer. That experience taught me so many lessons about the power of theater to foster collaboration and share meaningful stories, as well as the public values that attach themselves to building a safe place where everyone is welcome. All those lessons served me well as a managing leader and producer both sides of the border and both sides of the commercial and non-profit theater divide. Arriving here in Southwest with my good wife Tracy and our daughter Greta Lee in 2009 makes me feel like I am well-equipped to do a good job for you all. I am honored to have been recognized for my service to, and leadership of, the Washington, D.C.-area theater community as a recipient of Theatre Washington's inaugural Victor Shargai Leadership Award in 2022.


