






# ARENA STAGE'S MISSION

# **ARTISTICALLY** SPFAKING

For nearly 75 years, Arena has fought to reflect our country's multifaceted humanity in a continuous effort to serve, as Zelda Fichandler once brilliantly described, "the revelation and shaping of the process of living." John Leguizamo's The Other Americans is a searing new addition to the theatrical canon in that venerated tradition of the Great American Tragedy. The Other Americans ushers in a new era.

bringing a modern and vibrant family, never before seen on stage, out of the margins and squarely into the center as they grapple with the cost of pursuing the American Dream.

When I first encountered an early draft of John Leguizamo's The Other Americans, I immediately understood that Nelson Castro would take his place on the continuum of stories defined by fractured men trapped in lives smaller than their spirits, and the reality of the tremendous cost paid by those who love them most. Inspired by actual events, it seeks to shine a bright and unflinching light on the profoundly human journey of this Colombian-American family's pursuit of the promise of our country-never before witnessed on our stages. And yet, this tragedy is a familiar one. Leguizamo's patriarch, Nelson Castro-like Willy Loman, Walter Lee Younger, James Tyrone, and Troy Maxson canonically before him-grapples with the idea that the world somehow owes you a stronger hand than you've been dealt and it's up to you, and you alone, to fight for what you deserve. We all bear witness to the wreckage of these choices, and in his toils, we can see ourselves—our fits, furies, and failings, and our fundamentally human hope for something better.

As Arena Stage continues its work producing art that reveals the full spectrum of the American spirit, we are called to create space for the birth of groundbreaking and ofttimes heartbreaking art which centers the love, passion, and resilience of real families, searching for healing against the ire of a world intent on rendering their experiences invisible.

Richly layered, complex, and full of love, the Castro family is undeniably and canonically American. We are invited into their kitchen—to the spicy aroma of sofrito cooking, to disco music's contagious refrains—as they dance, cook, bathe in laughter, kindle old loves, and nurture new ones, all the while reaching across the divide for acknowledgment and understanding. The Castro family's central backbone—a relentless determination to find joy, and each other, amidst the wreckage—is the universal lifeblood of the human spirit. These small and precious moments of tenderness are a necessary salve for Nicky, Toni, Patti, and Nelson, and indeed for all of us, as we look for joy in the face of a tenuous future.

It is impossible not to find resonance in the particulars of the Castro family's lives and their triumphs and struggles as parents, lovers, entrepreneurs, and dreamers. Leguizamo has brought us a quintessentially American story, and I hope you find healing in its undeniable truths.

# FROM THE **FXFCIITIVE PRODUCER**

Welcome to the premiere of John Leguizamo's The Other Americans.

You may have noticed the lovely landscaping around Arena's building as you entered today, or as you have walked by. Those more seasoned patrons may remember several different attempts over the last 14 years to make our outside space

as beautiful as our inside. Unfortunately, you may also remember more than one not entirely successful attempt! I'm pleased that now it looks wonderful.

The current landscaping is a brilliant example of the Southwest Business Improvement District or SWBID. What is a BID? A BID is a not-for-profit organization funded by business owners (or private property owners) within a specific geographic area that uses resources to supplement government services, like neighborhood cleaning, security, capital improvements, and other initiatives for the betterment of the community.

As you may be aware or remember, Arena's Southwest neighborhood looked quite different 20 years ago. Longtime patrons will recall the Waterside Mall and how it split 4th Street. The waterfront had a number of businesses, including the Channel Inn, Hogate's, and Phillips Flagship. The Fish Market was (mostly) in the same spot but with an entirely different look.

When the Washington Nationals moved in down the street in 2005, Arena was excited to have renewed attention to the neighborhood. Then Arena launched its own renewal which resulted in our fabulous Mead Center for American Theater, However, in 2011 the Wharf was still a dream. As the time of the Mead Center's opening and construction of the Wharf began, Steve Moore championed the concept of a BID for Southwest. Parts of the neighborhood were in disrepair, but moreover he knew that it would be necessary to keep the community together throughout the massive changes happening.

In 2014, Steve Moore as Executive Director and the SWBID's only other employee took up residence in Arena's administrative office as our guests and built the framework for the SWBID. Within two years they had found separate office space and made great strides toward brightening our area. The refurbishment of the Duck Pond was an early victory, as were beautiful murals and getting folks out in the now ubiquitous blue shirts to keep the sidewalks clean. The SWBID provides gathering opportunities for residents, such as Sunday Suppers and the Farmers Market on 4th Street.

SWBID is back in Arena's building again, providing cleaning services inside as well as landscaping services outside. We're supported by their security services as well.

I harken back to one of Arena's founding principles which is to be resident in the community as a way to welcome authentically artists, like the company for The Other Americans, and you, as our audience, in a community we've built, treasure, and maintain together.



HANA S. SHARIF (Artistic Director) has enjoyed a multi-faceted theater career, including roles as an artistic leader, director, playwright, and producer with a specialty in strategic and cross-functional leadership. Hana began her professional career as an undergraduate student at Spelman College. From 1997 to 2003, Hana served as the co-founder and Artistic Director of Nasir Productions, a theater dedicated to underrepresented voices challenging traditional structure. Hana ioined the Tony® Award-winning regional theater, Hartford Stage, in 2003. During her decade-long tenure at Hartford Stage. Hana served as the Associate Artistic Director, Director of New Play Development. and Artistic Producer. Hana launched the new play development program, expanded the community engagement and civic discourse initiatives, and developed and produced Tony®, Grammy, Pulitzer, and Obie Award-winning shows. Starting in 2012, she served as Program Manager at ArtsEmerson, a leading world theater company based at Boston's Emerson College. During her tenure at ArtsEmerson, Hana launched an Artists in Residency program, led a research program assessing barriers to inclusion across the region, and leveraged her regional theater experience to freelance produce for smaller theater companies looking to expand and restructure their administrative teams. Hana was Baltimore Center Stage's Associate Artistic Director from 2014 to 2019 and was the architect of the innovative CS Digital program: a platform that pushes the boundaries of traditional theater and looks at the nexus point between art and technology. Her other achievements at Baltimore Center Stage included prototyping the Mobile Unit focused on historically underserved audiences. strenathenina community engagement, producing multiple world and regional premieres, and helping to guide the theater through a multi-million dollar building renovation and rebranding effort. Hana became the first Black woman to lead a major regional theater in 2018 when she was named the Augustin Family Artistic Director of The Repertory Theatre of St. Louis. During her tenure at The Rep. Hana guided the organization through a alignment, revolutionized the strategic New Works program, expanding access to underserved communities, and centering equity and anti-racism as the organization's foundational values. Hana holds a BA from Spelman College and an MFA from the University of Houston, Hana is the recipient of USITT's 2023 Distinguished Achievement Award, Spelman's 2022 National Community Service Award, the 2009-10 Aetna New Voices Fellowship, EMC Arts Working Open Fellowship, and Theatre Communications Group (TCG) New Generations Fellowship. Hana is a founding member of The Black Theatre Commons (BTC). She serves on the board of directors for the TCG, BTC, and the Sprott Family Foundation.

EDGAR DOBIE (Executive Producer) Born in Vernon, British Columbia, a village next to the Rocky Mountains (three years after Arena had its first performance in 1950). I am one of five brothers raised by my Dad Edgar, a mechanic and small businessman. and Mom Connie, a telephone operator and union organizer. I am the only Dobie to make a career in theater. Luckily for me, drama was an arts elective I was offered at the tender age of 12 so I hung up my hockey skates and joined the drama class, led by teacher Paddy Malcolm and her fledgling Powerhouse Community Theater after school. By the time I graduated from high school, we volunteers had built ourselves a 200-seat, fully equipped theater on its own piece of land in the center of town and found a sold-out audience for the full season of plays we had on offer. That experience taught me so many lessons about the power of theater to foster collaboration and share meaningful stories, as well as the public values that attach themselves to building a safe place where everyone is welcome. All those lessons served me well as a managing leader and producer both sides of the border and both sides of the commercial and non-profit

theater divide. Arriving here in Southwest with my good wife Tracy and our daughter Greta Lee in 2009 makes me feel like I am well-equipped to do a good job for you all. I am honored to have been recognized for my service to, and leadership of, the Washington, D.C.-area theater community as a recipient of Theatre Washington's inaugural Victor Shargai Leadership Award in 2022.




