> FULL COMPANY ANNOUNCED FOR D.C. PREMIERE OF LYDIA R. DIAMOND'S SMART PEOPLE APRIL 14-MAY 21, 2017 AT ARENA STAGE

*** Deputy Artistic Director Seema Sueko makes Arena Stage directorial debut with provocative and funny play exploring the unavoidable nature of cultural bias ***

(Washington, D.C.) Four intellectuals—a doctor, an actress, a psychologist and a neurobiologist studying the human brain's response to race—search for love, acceptance and identity in Lydia R. Diamond's comedy-drama *Smart People*, which makes its D.C. debut at Arena Stage. Set against the backdrop of Obama's 2008 election, Diamond's fiercely funny play explores the unavoidable nature of cultural bias. Deputy Artistic Director **Seema Sueko** makes her Arena Stage directorial debut with this "sexy, serious and very, very funny modern-day comedy of manners" (*Variety*). *Smart People* runs April 14-May 21, 2017 in the Kreeger Theater.

The four-person cast features Lorene Chesley (La Jolla Playhouse's *Memphis*) as Valerie Johnston, **Gregory Perri** (Broadway's Good People) as Brian White, **Sue Jin Song** (Manhattan Theatre Club's *The World of Extreme Happiness*) as Ginny Yang and **Jaysen Wright** (Studio Theatre's Choir Boy) as Jackson Moore.

"I am a big fan of Lydia Diamond, and *Smart People* is one of the smartest plays I've encountered in recent years," says Artistic Director **Molly Smith**. "What a fascinating play to produce now, a few months into a new administration that is quite the opposite of the one featured in this play. Lydia's play will take on new meaning in the current era of fake news. Seema Sueko will definitely lead this talented cast to an insightful performance."

"Smart People is a smart, complex, nuanced play that explores the science and psychology of racism and implicit bias through the lens of four smart people who are fighting to be seen and seeking to be loved," shares **Sueko**. "At times this play is explosive and at other times it's laugh out loud funny. As you can imagine, casting actors who have the depth, range, humor and passion is critical to the success of this show. I have found that in Gregory, Sue Jin, Jaysen and Lorene. I am excited to dive into the rehearsal room with these excellent artists."

"I am honored that Arena Stage is producing *Smart People*," adds **Diamond**. "Arena has made itself an artistic home for me again and again, from play development, a commission, residency and now two productions—this sort of long-term investment is the key to empowering writers to do what we do, as well and prolifically as possible. Seema's sophisticated and culturally relevant voice is perfect for the stewardship of this play, a story that wants desperately to be in conversation with this city, in this country, at this time."

Lydia R. Diamond (*Playwright*) is a 2013/14 Arena Stage resident playwright. Award-winning plays include *Smart People, Stick Fly, Voyeurs de Venus, The Bluest Eye, The Gift Horse, Harriet Jacobs, The Inside* and *Stage Black.* Theaters include Broadway's Cort Theatre, The Arden, Chicago Dramatists, Company One, Congo Square, Goodman, Guthrie, Hartford Stage, Huntington, Jubilee, Kansas City Repertory, Long Wharf, Lorraine Hansberry, McCarter, Mo`olelo, MPAACT, New Vic, Playmakers Repertory, Plowshares, Second Stage, Steppenwolf and True Colors. Commissions from Arena Stage, Steppenwolf, McCarter, Huntington, Center Stage, Victory Gardens and Roundabout. Lydia was a W.E.B. Du Bois Institute non-resident fellow, TCG/NEA playwright-in-residence at Steppenwolf, Huntington playwright fellow, Sundance Institute Playwright Lab creative advisor, Radcliffe Institute fellow and serves on the Dramatists Guild Legal Defense Fund Board of Directors. She is a Northwestern University graduate and has an honorary doctorate of arts from Pine Manor College.

Seema Sueko (*Director*) joined the Arena Stage staff in July 2016 as deputy artistic director. She previously served as associate artistic director at The Pasadena Playhouse and executive artistic director of Mo`olelo Performing Arts Company in San Diego. Her directing and acting credits include The Pasadena Playhouse, People's Light, The Old Globe, San Diego Repertory, La Jolla Playhouse, Yale Repertory, 5th Avenue Theatre, Native Voices and Mo`olelo, among others. As a playwright, she received commissions from Mixed Blood Theatre and Center Stage. Her work has been recognized by the California State Assembly, NAACP San Diego Branch, San Diego Theatre Critics Circle, Chicago Jeff Awards, American Theatre Wing and *American Theatre* magazine. Seema serves on the Diversity Committee of the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society.

A native of the Washington D.C. metropolitan area, Lorene grew up studying ballet and tap but quickly segued her love for performance into acting. Gregory Perri (Brian White) is thrilled to be making his Arena Stage debut. METRO: Arena Stage at the Mead Center for American Theater is only one block from the Waterfront-SEU Metro station (Green Line). When exiting the station, walk west on M Street toward Sixth Street, and the main entrance to the Mead Center is on the right.

PARKING: Parking is available in Arena Stage's on-site garage. Subscribers may purchase parking in advance for \$16. Single ticket buyers may purchase parking in advance for \$19 or on the day of the performance for \$22 on a first-come, first-served basis. Limited handicapped parking is available by reservation. Advanced parking must be reserved by calling 202-488-3300. The entrance to the Mead Center garage is on Maine Avenue between Sixth and Seventh streets, and the garage closes one hour after the day's last performance ends. Patrons can also park at the Public Parking Garage at 1101 Fourth Street, one block from the Mead Center, for \$14. Street parking is also available along Maine Avenue.

VALET PARKING: Arena Stage offers valet service at no additional cost to patrons with accessibility needs who call 202-488-3300 in advance to request valet parking. On days when valet parking is being used for accessibility, it is also available to general patrons one hour prior to show time for \$25, based on availability. To use valet parking, pull up to the main entrance on Sixth Street.
