SINGER/SONGWRITER BENJAMIN SCHEUER
BRINGS SOLO MUSICAL THE LION
TO ARENA STAGE AT THE MEAD CENTER FOR AMERICAN THEATER
FEBRUARY 26-APRIL 10, 2016

(Washington, D.C.) Award-winning singer/songwriter Benjamin Scheuer's solo musical *The Lion* makes its Washington, D.C. debut at Arena Stage at the Mead Center for American Theater. Scheuer uses his guitar—actually, six guitars—to take audiences on a rock 'n' roll journey and tell a heartwarming coming-of-age story that explores his transition from boyhood to manhood. Called an "irresistible winner" and "deeply moving" by *New York Daily News*, *The Lion* is presented in association with Eva Price and runs February 26-April 10, 2016 in the Arlene and Robert Kogod Cradle.

The Lion is directed by **Sean Daniels**, named "one of the top 15 up-and-coming artists in the U.S. whose work will be transforming America's stages for decades to come" by *American Theatre*, and comes to Arena Stage as part of a multi-city tour. *The Lion* premiered Off-Broadway at Manhattan Theatre Club/New York City Center in 2014 and received an encore run at the Lynn Redgrave Theater, winning the Drama Desk Award for Outstanding Solo Performance.

"Sometimes you come across a little show with a big heart. This is a beautiful example," shares **Artistic Director Molly Smith**. "Benjamin Scheuer brings us his personal story about the complexities of family relationships, but really what he brings is his love of music. Art truly makes beauty out of the challenges of life."

"When John Lennon was asked about how to write a good song, he said, 'Tell the truth and make it rhyme,'" says **Scheuer**. "I'm doing my very best to follow his advice."

"Benjamin Scheuer is the most dangerously honest charmer I know," adds **Daniels**. "As someone who was born in Potomac, Maryland and grew up going to Arena Stage with my parents, it's an absolute honor to get to return to share this incredibly brave and healing story."

Benjamin Scheuer (Writer/Performer) is the recipient of the 2015 Drama Desk Award for Outstanding Solo Performance and a 2015 Theatre World Award. The animated music videos for Benjamin's songs "The Lion" and "Cookie-tin Banjo" have won prizes at the Annecy Film Festival, British Animation Awards, Encounters Film Festival, Crystal Palace Festival and Buenos Aires' ExpoToons Film Festival. Benjamin's album "Songs from THE LION" will be released in 2016, along with animated videos for the songs "Weather the Storm" and "Cure." With photographer Riya Lerner, Benjamin is co-creator of the art book "Between Two Spaces," from which 50 percent of proceeds go to the Leukemia/Lymphoma Society (www.betweentwospaces.com). Benjamin has toured with Mary Chapin Carpenter and performed at venues including Royal Albert Hall in London and Lincoln Center in New York. He has been a writer-in-residence at Goodspeed, Weston Playhouse and the Johnny Mercer Songwriting Workshop and been commissioned by Williamstown Theatre Festival. Benjamin lives in New York Citv. His direction and shows have won "Best New Musical" in London; the Drama Desk Award in New York City; and "Best Play" and "Best Director" in the Bay Area, Rochester and Atlanta. His shows have also been nominated for a Lucille Lortel and Outer Critics Circle Award. Sean was named "one of the top 15 up-and-coming artists in the U.S. whose work will be transforming America's stages for decades to come" and "one of seven people reshaping and revitalizing the American musical" by American Theatre. He is the artistic director of Merrimack Repertory Theatre. He previously served as artist-atlarge for Geva Theatre Center and spent four years at the Tony Award-winning Actors Theatre of Louisville as the theater's associate artistic director, where he directed 17 productions including five Humana Festivals. Sean is the former associate artistic director/resident director of California Shakespeare Theater and before that spent a decade as artistic director and co-founder of Dad's Garage Theatre Company in Atlanta. METRO: Arena Stage at the Mead Center for American Theater is only one block from the Waterfront-SEU Metro station (Green Line). When exiting the station, walk west on M Street toward Sixth Street, and the main entrance to the Mead Center is on the right.

PARKING: Parking is available in Arena Stage's on-site garage. Subscribers may purchase parking in advance for \$16. Single ticket buyers may purchase parking in advance for \$19 or on the day of the performance for \$22 on a first-come, first-served basis. Limited handicapped parking is available by reservation. Advanced parking must be reserved by calling 202-488-3300. The entrance to the Mead Center garage is on Maine Avenue between Sixth and Seventh streets, and the garage closes one hour after the day's last performance ends. Patrons can also park at the Public Parking Garage at 1101 Fourth Street, one block from the Mead Center, for \$11. Street parking is also available along Maine Avenue.

VALET PARKING: Arena Stage offers valet service at no additional cost to patrons with accessibility needs who call 202-488-3300 in advance to request valet parking. On days when valet parking is being used for accessibility, it is also available to general patrons one hour prior to show time for \$25, based on availability. To use valet parking, pull up to the main entrance on Sixth Street.
