Democracy and diversity, deep and dangerous. There were many discussions about these words. In light of recent events, it will be more important than ever to go to the deep and dangerous places — to create the change we want to see in the world.

Black lives matter. All lives cannot matter until this no longer has to be said.


August Wilson said: “Confront the dark parts of yourself, and work to banish them with illumination and forgiveness. Your willingness to wrestle with your demons will cause your angels to sing.”

Arena Stage vows again to always do this. Arena Stage will always be a champion for American voices and values.
