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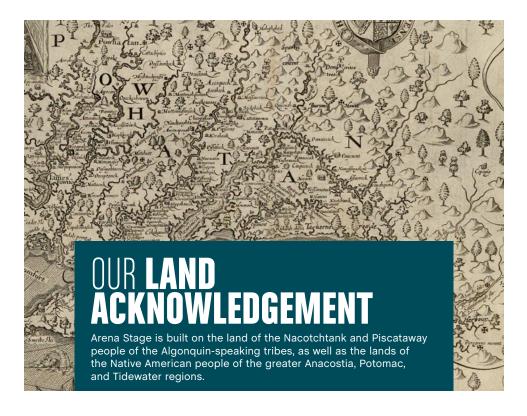
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ARENA STAGE'S MISSION

ARTISTICALLY SPFAKING

"We have to be braver than we think we can be." - Madeleine L'Engle

There are stories that live in the marrow of generations. Stories passed between hands, across dinner tables, and through the hush of bedtime rituals. Stories that stretch our imaginations, challenge our sense of the impossible, and remind us that light can prevail over darkness. A Wrinkle in Time belongs to that rare constellation of stories—ones that invite us to dream forward, to leap into the unknown, and to trust that even the smallest flicker of light can guide us home.

Madeleine L'Engle's classic tale, first published in 1962, has had deep cultural resonance for decades, offering young readers—and the young at heart—a thrilling and soul-deep reminder that love, courage, and connection are forces more powerful than time itself. In my home, we have three generations of passionate women who found a champion and strength through the protagonist of this timeless classic. At its center is Meg Murry: awkward, angry, brilliant, braye, A girl who doesn't always see herself as the one the story depends on, until she realizes she's always held the strength to protect what matters most. Meg's expedition through the fifth dimension is a mirror for our own human strength and fallibility, a journey towards believing that our inner light, no matter how fragile, can illuminate the universe.

It is an immense honor to close my inaugural season at Arena Stage with this extraordinary world premiere. At the heart of this new musical is an otherworldly score by Heather Christian, whose music bends time and sound into something wholly original, and a book adapted by the luminous Lauren Yee that is at once tender, sharp, and unafraid to leap across dimensions. Ani Tai's joyful choreography brings the piece to life, and director Lee Sunday Evans guides the artistry with remarkable clarity and care, rendering the vast cosmic worlds these characters traverse with emotional precision and deep humanity. It is no small feat to adapt a story so beloved, so boldly metaphysical, and yet, they have done so with musicality and humor. To witness these artists in collaboration is to glimpse what is possible when women are given the space to imagine boldly, to lead fully, and to be heard without limitation. What a gift it is to be part of this journey, to help usher a musical this original and profound into the world.

As this season draws to a close, I find myself reflecting on the boldness of our shared undertaking. Thank you for joining us for this final production of the 2024/25 Season. May Meg's journey awaken the courage within you to face the darkness, embrace the unknown, and trust in the radiant, resilient power of your own heart.

EXECUTIVE PRODUCER

I am inspired today to share a short paragraph from a letter I wrote to Arena's Board of Trustees in July 2013. You'll see why when we get to the end. It was the closing paragraph to a three-page update on Arena's status at the time.

In closing, I wanted to answer a question my daughter Greta Lee (almost 4) posed for me a little while ago. Mostly she thinks (based on a scary encounter she had with the larger-than-life GEICO Gecko in our lobby during a sponsor event in our opening season) that we built the center as a home for the gecko and my job is to make sure he has all the pizza he can eat. But lately that fascination has given way to different questions like, "Why do you go to the theater?" and "What do you do there?" Well, I have gotten away with simple answers for now by answering that "I go to the theater, Greta Lee, to help make stories." That answer led me to remember a quote from the author Madeleine L'Engle, who many of you probably know from her young adult novel A Wrinkle in Time.

"Why does anybody tell a story? It does indeed have something to do with faith. Faith that the universe has meaning, that our little human lives are not irrelevant, that what we choose or say or do matters, matters cosmically."

My daughter long ago shed her fear that I worked with giant geckos, but the quote remains powerful and meaningful, even more so today as we witness Ms. L'Engle's imagination come to life in the Kreeger Theater.

Will the desires for stories ever ebb? Will our quest for relevance never be fulfilled? I say no to both. I emphatically believe that what we choose to do and say matters cosmically. In moments of both calm and political strife, tackling an adventure that crosses worlds gives us-or me, at least-hope that our human resilience may waver but is ultimately unbreakable.

I admit part of the inspiration to recall the reference to Greta Lee's questions is also from Meg's determination and journey. Greta Lee is now 15 and fully aware of life's disappointments and surprises. I am hopeful that the worlds as we know them-and as we imagine them-remain open and welcoming. Most likely any parent reading this is nodding along, although I also feel confident that people of all ages and backgrounds are also nodding. And, ideally, we are all feeling the same determination to cross worlds for causes we believe in.

What a pure joy to have these artists—on stage and behind the scenes—bring this amazing (in the true definition of the word amazing) story to life. May it bring you the hope and joy that it is bringing me.

Ordinary Heroes

"There's a hero
If you look inside your heart
You don't have to be afraid
Of what you are
There's an answer
If you reach into your soul
And the sorrow that you know
Will melt away"

- Mariah Carey, "Hero"

Few people, technically no one at all, are born heroes. To be a hero is rarely determined by one's circumstances at birth. Heroics and heroism are not birthrights because they are expressed in actions, behaviors, choices, and responses to situations. As such, heroism springs from necessity, opportunity, or both. Madeleine L'Engle's A Wrinkle in Time, first published in 1962, follows three unlikely heroes—siblings Margaret "Meg" Murry and Charles Wallace Murry and their friend Calvin O'Keefe—from Earth to the fifth dimension.

Their heroism is notable because of their ages and the fact that they must rescue an adult. Meg, Charles Wallace, and Calvin are still dependent on adults for their care and survival; yet, three supernatural figures (Mrs Whatsit, Mrs Who, and Mrs

Which) urge the children on a quest to save Dr. Alex Murry. Their opportunity for heroism springs from a double-edged truth: there are things from which the adults in their lives cannot protect them and only they are capable of correcting what is wrong in the world. In popular young adult fiction prior to A Wrinkle in Time, young characters came to adventures primarily to save or learn something about themselves, as is the case in The Wizard of Oz and Alice in Wonderland. In A Wrinkle in Time, L'Engle invites her characters and readers to think about one's responsibility to others. An important and looming question in the work seems to be: Who are we called to be in the world and how do we fulfill that? For Meg, Charles Wallace, and Calvin, they find one answer to that question in their commitments to others.



In our world, too, not just in literature, children and young adults answer calls to heroism and play pivotal roles in shaping our worlds. In 1960, six-year-old Ruby Bridges was among the first African-American children to integrate the New Orleans, Louisiana school system. Ruby's first day at her new school is depicted in the Norman Rockwell painting The Problem We All Live With. The image focuses on Ruby being escorted by US marshals while just outside of the frame she faced insults, threats, and things hurled at her. Decades later in 2012, Malala Yousafzai was shot by a Taliban gunman in an assassination attempt in response to advocacy work for the education of women and girls, which she began in 2009 at age eleven. The age of these change agents makes their labors even more striking.

Similarly, Meg is twelve years old in the novel and thirteen in the 2018 film directed by Ava DuVernay while Charles Wallace is five years old in the book and six years old in DuVernay's movie adaptation. When called to action, they did not let their youth, inexperience, or imperfections stop them from trying. With hope, grit, and faith, they committed to do what needed to be done and along the way discovered that they had everything they needed for the journey and anything they lacked was provided along the way. Among the many enduring ideas in A Wrinkle in Time, I am thankful for the reminder that no matter how old or unqualified we feel, we have within us the power to effect change, to be a hero to someone or some cause.

HANA S. SHARIF (Artistic Director) has enjoyed a multi-faceted theater career, including roles as an artistic leader, director, playwright, and producer with a specialty in strategic and cross-functional leadership. Hana began her professional career as an undergraduate student at Spelman College. From 1997 to 2003, Hana served as the co-founder and Artistic Director of Nasir Productions, a theater dedicated to underrepresented voices challenging traditional structure. Hana joined the Tony® Award-winning regional theater, Hartford Stage, in 2003. During her decadelong tenure at Hartford Stage, Hana served as the Associate Artistic Director, Director of New Play Development, and Artistic Producer. Hana launched the new play development program, expanded the community engagement and civic discourse initiatives, and developed and produced Tony®, Grammy, Pulitzer, and Obie Award-winning shows. Starting in 2012, she served as Program Manager at ArtsEmerson, a leading world theater company based at Boston's Emerson College. During her tenure at ArtsEmerson, Hana launched an Artists in Residency program, led a research program assessing barriers to inclusion across the region, and leveraged her regional theater experience to freelance produce for smaller theater companies looking to expand and restructure their administrative teams. Hana was Baltimore Center Stage's Associate Artistic Director from 2014 to 2019 and was the architect of the innovative CS Digital program: a platform that pushes the boundaries of traditional theater and looks at the nexus point between art and technology. Her other achievements at Baltimore Center Stage included prototyping the Mobile Unit focused on historically underserved audiences, strengthening community engagement, producing multiple world and regional premieres, and helping to guide the theater through a multi-million dollar building renovation and rebranding effort. Hana became the first Black woman to lead a major regional theater in 2018 when she was named the Augustin Family Artistic Director of The Repertory Theatre of St. Louis. During her tenure at The Rep, Hana guided the organization through a strategic alignment, revolutionized the New Works program, expanding access to underserved communities, and centering equity and anti-racism as the organization's foundational values. Hana holds a BA from Spelman College and an MFA from the University of Houston. Hana is the recipient of USITT's 2023 Distinguished Achievement Award, Spelman's 2022 National Community Service Award, the 2009-10 Aetna New Voices Fellowship, EMC Arts Working Open Fellowship, and Theatre Communications Group (TCG) New Generations Fellowship. Hana is a founding member of The Black Theatre Commons (BTC). She serves on the board of directors for the TCG, BTC, and the Sprott Family Foundation.

EDGAR DOBIE (Executive Producer) Born in Vernon, British Columbia, a village next to the Rocky Mountains (three years after Arena had its first performance in 1950), I am one of five brothers raised by my Dad Edgar, a mechanic and small businessman, and Mom Connie, a telephone operator and union organizer. I am the only Dobie to make a career in theater. Luckily for me, drama was an arts elective I was offered at the tender age of 12 so I hung up my hockey skates and joined the drama class, led by teacher Paddy Malcolm and her fledgling Powerhouse Community Theater after school. By the time I graduated from high school, we volunteers had built ourselves a 200-seat, fully equipped theater on its own piece of land in the center of town and found a sold-out audience for the full season of plays we had on offer. That experience taught me so many lessons about the power of theater to foster collaboration and share meaningful stories, as well as the public values that attach themselves to building a safe place where everyone is welcome. All those lessons served me well as a managing leader and producer both sides of the border and both sides of the commercial and non-profit theater divide. Arriving here in Southwest with my good wife Tracy and our daughter Greta Lee in 2009 makes me feel like I am well-equipped to do a good job for you all. I am honored to have been recognized for my service to, and leadership of, the Washington, D.C.-area theater community as a recipient of Theatre Washington's inaugural Victor Shargai Leadership Award in 2022.

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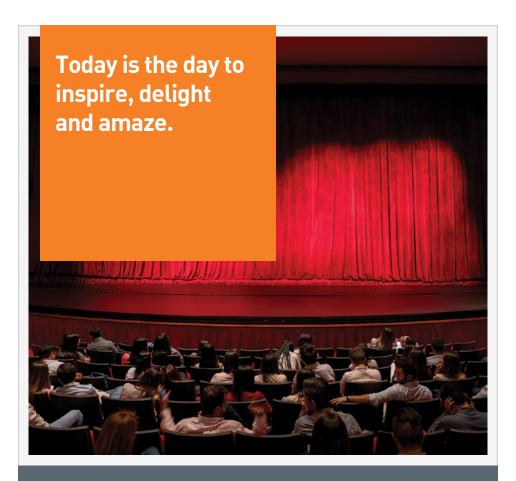
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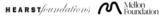
