As the world's first holiday show incorporating the African American tradition of stepping – characters include fabulous furry friends from the Arctic Kingdom, "Popper the Penguin" and "Polo the Polar Bear," and let's not forget "DJ Nutcracker" – Step Afrika!'s *Magical Musical Holiday Step Show* is a unique, music-filled holiday event for the entire family where – spoiler alert – kids might even get to dance on Arena's fabulous Fichandler Stage!

Founded in 1994 by **C. Brian Williams**, Step Afrika! is the first professional company dedicated to the tradition of stepping. Step Afrika! blends percussive dance styles practiced by historically African American fraternities and sororities; traditional African dances; and an array of contemporary dance and art forms into a cohesive, compelling artistic experience. Performances are much more than dance shows; they integrate songs, storytelling, humor, and audience participation. The blend of technique, agility, and pure energy makes each performance unique and leaves the audience with their hearts pounding.

"There is no other holiday performance like Step Afrika!'s Magical Musical Holiday Step Show. This production was created with the entire family in mind and has become a longstanding tradition for

many in the DMV," said C. Brian Williams. "After months of touring all over the world from Bolivia to Bangor, Maine, we are thrilled to be home and celebrate the holidays in Washington, D.C."

Under Mr. Williams' leadership, stepping has evolved into one of America's leading cultural exports. Step Afrika! has toured more than 60 countries across the globe, and the company now ranks as one of the top 10 African American dance companies in the United States. Mr. Williams was recently honored as a 2022 National Endowment for the Arts National Heritage Fellow. He is featured in the documentary, "Roots of American Culture," a celebration of the artistry of all the 2022 National Heritage Fellows, which is scheduled for release November 17.

With 14 full-time dancers and administrative team of 6, Step Afrika! is one of the top 10 U.S. African American dance companies. The Company reaches thousands each year through a 50-city tour of American colleges and theaters and performs globally as an official U.S. Cultural Ambassador. New work, such as The Migration: Reflections on Jacob Lawrence and Drumfolk, tour to major U.S. cities. Step Afrika! is featured at the Smithsonian's National Museum of African American History & Culture with the world's first interactive stepping exhibit. stepafrika.org

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
